The Trout Gallery at 40

As The Trout Gallery moves into its fortieth year at Dickinson College, its anniversary provides an opportunity to pause and reflect on the myriad ways it has touched the lives of its audiences. This exhibition represents a visual manifestation of that reflection. It is comprised of works of art from The Gallery's permanent collection that were chosen by a cross-section of Trout audiences. Some of these are former Dickinson students, some are Carlisle community members, and still others are the donors who give generously to The Gallery and the faculty and staff members that have actively used the collection in their professional work.


For this exhibition, participating audiences were asked to write a label to accompany their chosen object. In the invitation letter, Gallery staff offered some guidelines:

The concept for the show is to offer a more intimate view of the diverse ways that audiences respond to works of art. We each bring our own life experiences, but also our distinctive sensibilities and interests to artistic interactions. In addition, many of you have collected Trout Gallery objects, taught with them, or watched audiences respond to them, and so you may have specific memories you are interested in sharing... These labels are intended to allow viewers a glimpse of how individuals, personally, see and experience a specific work of art.

The resulting labels provide an array of perspectives on why art is important, how it is viewed, and what it means to individuals. As a whole, these labels offer visitors the opportunity to consider different approaches to thinking about and interacting with art objects. They also offer an alternative to the singular curatorial voice that typifies museum exhibitions, providing instead a multitude of viewpoints without an overarching thematic focus. In this case, the exhibition has many themes and it is up to the visitor to decide upon which to focus.
